The City of St. Marys operates a full-time Police Department with 15 full-time State Certified Law Enforcement Officers, four full-Dispatchers, time and Administrative Assistant who also serves as Code Enforcement Officer and Parking Enforcement Officer, and elementary School Crossing Guards. The Department provides 24-hour coverage to the citizens of our community utilizing six marked video equipped patrol cars. Officers also patrol on motorcycle, bicycle and on foot.

Officers have specialized training in such areas as accident reconstruction, polygraph examination, crime scene processing, drug investigations and crime prevention to name a few. The Department is also an active member of the Grand Lake Task Force.

It is the mission of the City of St. Marys Police Department to enhance the quality of life in our community by working in partnership with the citizens of the community to enforce the laws, preserve the peace, and provide a safe environment for our residents and visitors to live and work. The City of St. Marys Police Department is dedicated to fulfilling this expectation to the community by maintaining a professional, pro-active law enforcement agency through community oriented policing, established professional standards, quality training programs, and community relations.
