#### **Program**

Our new District Governor, Maris Brenner, has over four decades of experience in sales at resorts, with the last 11 years at Kalahari Resort and Water Park in Sandusky.

She related how when new to Sandusky, she asked community leaders the best way to get involved and meet people, and they repeatedly told her to join Rotary. And she related that when dealing with her husband's illness and traveling back from the hospital in Toledo to a Sandusky Rotary meeting, she felt that Rotary had indeed become her family.

To help us understand the international scope of Rotary and the "Heartbeat of Rotary", Maris related her journey from DG Elect to installation. At each step from Area to Zone to Country to International, the numbers grew, the enthusiasm grew as the geographic scope grew. It was also important to understand that even when the Rotary International President Elect, Sam Alawi, passed away in the year before he was to

take office, Barry Russin was ready to step in to carry on.

Particularly inspiring was the story of the international convocation of District Governors Elect in San Diego, with each of over 5,000 participants supplied a drum and all building and reflecting the "Heartbeat of Rotary". An inspiring quote from this conference was "we need to spread the energy, to instill the love of the sea before providing the tools to build a boat".

She closed with a story of meeting a participant at the international conference from Nigeria who sought her out to express heartfelt gratitude for District 6600. This was because of a MESA shipment of 17 kidney dialysis machines to his country, each machine responsible for extending the lives of many of his countrymen.
